Jerilea Zempel has worn many hats during her career as a visual artist, art activist, art historian, art curator, and art professor. She has won grants from The National Endowment for the Arts, the New York Foundation, the Middle Atlantic Arts Foundation, CEC Arts Link, and the Gunk Foundation. Her public art projects have been exhibited nationally and internationally, from New York City to Poznan, Poland. A "yarn-bomber," before there was a word for it, a cover she crocheted for an SUV for the Canadian Cultural Capital Festival in Sackville, New Brunswick landed her on the Colbert Report in 2008.
