He has over 25 years of facilitation experience in adventure-based counseling and higher education settings, including in post-Katrina New Orleans, where he spearheaded Magnolia Project, UC Berkeley’s 10-year commitment to the people of the Gulf Coast. He deepened his understanding of race and class privilege through solidarity work with the prisoner hunger strikers in California prisons in 2011 and 2013. Currently he organizes with Dryden Human Dignity Coalition and is researching the stories of White settler allies in the North Country. He works at Cornell where he provides emerging leaders with the tools to build healthy communities.
